WHAT AM I?

"I am a document which companies ask employees to sign. I contain guidelines which make it clear how staff are to use the company computer system. I might even tell them what could happen if they don't follow the rules"

"I am a piece of software that everyone should install. I only allow websites and people using trusted I.P. addresses to access the computer system and files. When you visit a new website, I will often ask you whether you trust this site"

"I am a piece of software code. I can be downloaded from attachments in emails, in exe files and from some web pages. I won't damage your hardware but I could damage or change some of your important files. Under the Computer Misuse Act, it is illegal to give me to other people"

"I am a person who tries to break into your computer system. I might do it just for fun to see if I can actually manage it. Or, I might want to damage or change your files. If I am caught, I will be prosecuted under the Computer Misuse Act"

"I keep track of everything that happens in the company computer system. I can keep records of everyone who tries to access the system from outside. I can also keep records of what employees are doing, for example, what files they open, change and delete and who they send them to"
